School Profile:

Jules Verne Elementary School educates approximately 170 students living in the Pont-Viau and Lavaldes-Rapides areas. Jules Verne is a French immersion school wherein all students receive instruction in French and English. In K4 (Pre-Kindergarten) and K5 (Kindergarten), students are offered 92% of French instruction (français langue seconde enrichi) and 8% of English instruction, 120 minutes of ELA per week. In Cycle 1, 2 and 3 students are offered 54% of French instruction (français langue seconde enrichi) and 46% of English instruction. Due to its French immersion program the school attracts students from other surrounding districts. 130 (43%) of our students are out of zone. The school consists of 16 homeroom classes: 11 classrooms from Grades 1 to 6, 5 preschool classrooms (two K4 classes, one K4/K5 and two K5 classrooms), a library, a closed off kitchen, a gym, a zen room, two resources rooms and daycare services. Our daycare is open from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on regular school days and from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on pedagogical days. We have approximately 162 students registered as regular users.

At Jules Verne, we are committed to fostering an engaging and bilingual learning environment that promotes inclusivity, kindness, and academic rigor.



4. Educational Project 2024-2028

As a professional learning community, our objectives are to:

✓ Continue to increase the percentage of students who feel a positive sense of belonging which will in turn decrease the percentage of students with anxiety, decrease the number of students feeling bullied or excluded and increase the percentage of students feeling safe at school.

Orientation 1: To support and increase the success of diverse learners and at-risk students academically, socially, and emotionally

Objective 1: To decrease the feeling of anxiety of students at school as measured by the Our School Survey.

5. Anti-Violence & Anti Bullying Plan

The following preventative measures were been put in place to increase the percentage of students who feel a positive sense of belonging with the aim of decreasing the number of students with anxiety, decrease the number of studentsfeeling bullied or excluded to increase the number of students feeling safe attending school:

- Monthly class visits/assemblies/ circle of trust sessions to bring awareness on different topics such as: bullying, kindness, respect, responsibility, etc.
- The students will participate in anti-violence and anti-bullying activities throughout the year. Students will be sensitized to the effects of bullying through a student assembly and through different pedagogical activities outlined by MEQ.
- Buddy program involving cycle three students and grade one students.
- Buddy Benches Initiative
- Student Council participating in leadership initiatives to help make a difference and model the way for others.
- Cycle 3 students acting as playground leaders during recess to animate games for younger students
- Increase school spirit through organized community activities (bringing the school and school community together through special events) and setting school traditions
- Offer varied extra-curricular activities, and after school programs to students.
- Organization of class/cycle field trips at every level to provide students with the opportunities to bond with their peers and staff outside the classroom setting.
- The hiring of a Spec. Ed Tech who interacts with students and available for conflict resolution. The presence and interaction of the Spec. Ed Tech serves as a preventative measure.
- Organize class visits to educate students on character building. A character trait in each cycle is selected each month and students work hard to develop the trait as best as they can. In relation to this theme, teachers engage their students with classroom activities, short stories as well as classroom discussions. A student per homeroom is recognized for best displaying the character trait throughout the month.









- Gotcha Being Cool tickets will be promoted continuously throughout the year and students will be rewarded/praised for all acts of positive behaviour. This helps foster a positive school climate.
- Workshops/Presentations on different topic such as Bullying, Cyberbullying, Respect, highlighting Diversity will be offered to students.
